

TIP 2: VOLUNTEER AT A LOCAL CLIMATE OR SUSTAINABILITY EVENT

Stay informed about events run in your local area by environmental NGOs and ask how you can help organise the event.

TIP 1: LISTEN TO A CLIMATE-RELATED PODCAST ONCE A WEEK

You can listen during your commute, or while cooking. Use reliable sources such as: the BBC "The Climate Question" and Trinity College "The Trinity Climate Getaway".

TIP 3: SIGN UP TO A NEWSLETTER ABOUT CLIMATE CHANGE

Find an environmental organisation that you like and sign up to their newsletter.

TIP 4: VISIT PROTECTED LOCAL SITES OR NATURAL PARKS AND READ THE INFORMATION ABOUT ECOSYSTEMS

Get to know Ireland's national parks on www.nationalparks.ie and plan a visit.

TIP 5: VISIT A CLIMATE OR SUSTAINABILITY-FOCUSED EXHIBITION

Places like the National Gallery of Ireland, the Photo Museum Ireland or Explorium often regularly organise exhibitions or talks about the environment. Have a look at their agenda and participate in one of them.
